REPORT FROM THE CHAIR

2012 started with a splendid Writers' Week Booklovers' Breakfast hosted by the Independent Arts Foundation at Government House. We are most grateful to the Governor His Excellency Rear Admiral Kevin



Scarce and Mrs Liz Scarce for their attendance and gracious participation. Booklovers, guests,

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interstate visitors and writers all commented on the beautiful setting, the wholesome breakfast and the warm welcome they received. Congratulations to Convenor, Beverley Miller and the IAF Board for their organisation and efforts to make it such a successful event and fundraiser. Events like this help us support the arts, particularly emerging young artists such as Charlie Sanders and Liz Tobias.

You may have met Charlie last year when he was the MC for our 20th Anniversary Glamorous Occasion and also sang at our Christmas Party. Graduating from Adelaide College of the Arts in 2010, Charlie immediately formed his own theatre company called Early Worx, which received an Adelaide Critics' Award in 2011. Charlie's production of Australian author Joanna Murray-Smith's *Love Child* won the Best Production Award for the second week of the 2012 Fringe. IAF gave the company \$1,000 towards helping them take *Love Child* to the Edinburgh Fringe. IAF's assistance added to the recipients' credibility and gained them support from the Helpmann Academy and other sources. Similarly, earlier this year we assisted the outstanding young jazz pianist Liz Tobias with a \$1,000 donation to go to New York to successfully audition for further study. Liz is so grateful for this support that she presented an evening of popular jazz especially for IAF on 26th July at the Stamford Plaza.

In recent months many of our members have taken the opportunity to hear from the distinguished Artistic Directors of our major festivals. Greg Clarke (Fringe) and later this year David Sefton (Festival) and Jacinta Thompson (OzAsia) have all accepted our invitation to speak to our members. It is always so interesting to hear their plans and philosophy behind the programming choices. That the IAF can attract such eminent Artistic Directors to address us indicates the amount of respect the IAF has achieved in South Australia's arts community.

This year we have had many enjoyable activities and events and many more are planned for the rest of the year thanks to the chairs and committees members of the clubs: Lynn Crosby (Film); Cheryl Appelkamp (Literary); Beverley Miller (Performing Arts) Jessica Dames AM (Clare Regional). The support we give artists is greatly assisted by the generosity of our sponsors and we gratefully thank them: Panurgem Pty Ltd, Project Management and Training Specialists; Maria Kenda AM of Kendacraft Jewellery and Skye Cellars. 

FROM THE TREASURER

We have had a good financial year, ending the year with an operating balance of \$3,634. All our regular activities and special events have returned a profit. We raised \$18,384 after expenses and donated a total of \$14,750. In addition to the donations previously mentioned in other reports in this newsletter, the IAF

donated \$1,000 to South Australian producer, Corey McMahon, to support "The Share" by Daniel Keene at the Seymour Centre and also sponsored a \$1,000 SA Screen Award for Emerging Producer. A donation of \$1,000 has been made in July to support a young arts worker, Anastasia Farley, in the upcoming OzAsia production "Cambodia Sun Rising".

In January we transferred a further \$5,000 to our Term Deposit from our operating account and we now have a healthy \$22,366 on deposit which has earned us \$1,377 in interest. We will continue to keep these funds on deposit whilst we have a credit in our operating budget.

For a full and comprehensive report on our financial situation and all donations made I encourage you all to attend the AGM in August.

Just a reminder that membership fees provide the IAF with a good source of revenue that assists us in meeting our aim of providing much needed support for emerging artists in SA. Thank you for joining or renewing your membership and please encourage your friends and families to join the IAF, attend the functions and enjoy the benefits of our organisation.
